Final section of two-way for Crystal Drive is waiting on VDOT issues. The BID is having meetings with hotel GMs regarding the shuttle. The aquatics center is on hold due to overages in the cost estimates

Finance: The budget is on track.

National Marketing Campaign: Getting close on the B2B campaign.

Innovative: TechShop will open soon and has 400 members already. DesignLAB showed the office of the future and what is capable for office space in Crystal City. Crystal Tech Fund opened. TechCocktail is coming with lots of events.

Events/Programs: Crystal Couture returned to the biggest crowds yet. ARLive had over 250 people. The 1K Beer | Wine Walk is now one day. The BID is creating a "Wynwood" wall on 1851. Food Truck Thursday has returned to Crystal Drive. The Farmers Market is starting earlier in April and is back on Crystal Drive. ArtJamz had two events. 5K Fridays had 1,200 finishers for the first race. The Power Purge and Shred is coming up. May has the Floral Frenzy, Bike to Work Week, Phoenix Derby. Crystal Screen starts in June. The Air Force Association Cycling Class and Crystal Car are also in June.

Creative Expressive Branding: The BID is working on creative expressive branding. PBS Think Wednesday banners are part of creative expressive branding, and the BID is working with the County to have the flexibility to be able to do more big projects.
