Admin/Finance: The budget is tracking well. The BID presented at the County Board Work Session

Events/Programs: The BID is working on the Airport bridge, and has many meetings scheduled to support the project. The BID launched SoFar Sounds, a pop-up concert/house show that features three performers a night and about 100-150 attendees. Trek Tuesday is a new program that gives people a free hour of climbing at EarthTreks in the winter. Wednesday Night Spins had its best year ever with sold out races and great crowds. The BID has a new website with more a focus on the neighborhood and the Crystal City experience. Artomatic returned for the third time, and has huge crowds. Tossed and Found returned to a new location, and had big crowds again. FreshFarm Farmers Market launched. Mobile Bike Repair returned, with a new partner in VeloFix. In partnership with Gallery Underground, the BID expanded First Friday to include ArtJamz sessions, and programming at the pop-up library to create a new Arts experience every month. 5K Fridays have had great weather and crowds. The Hyatt artwall and a new piece by Justin Woodside are coming. Outdoor Yoga, Midday Mediation, and Outdoor Zumba are all kicking off in May. Bike to Work Week returns May 15th. Wine in the Waterpark has been renamed Fridays at the Fountain and will now run from June through October. MAVA TechBuzz is coming in June, as well as The Armed Forces Cycling Class and Crystal Car: A Father's Day Auto Festival. The Annual Meeting is June 12th.
